# Who we are





Supportive Homeland Association for Development is a non-governmental, non-profit Egyptian civil organization registered with the Ministry of Social Solidarity under number (9822). The foundation was established by a group of senior advisors and development experts with a social vision who have worked in the field of development since the end of the last century under the umbrella of the "International Development Support and Consulting Foundation (IDSC)," a specialized consulting company in developing and implementing sustainable development programs.

In response to the legislative reforms in 2014, which stipulated the need for civil society organizations to regularize their status under the supervision of the Ministry of Social Solidarity, **Supportive Homeland Association for Development** was founded as a non-profit entity affiliated with IDSC, enabling the continuation of development work in compliance with national laws.

The team consists of a select group of experts with over 30 years of experience working with prestigious international organizations such as: the

International Labour Organization (ILO), the German Agency for International Cooperation (GIZ), the Center for Development Services (CDS), and the United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime (UNODC). Their expertise covers multiple areas, including: health, economic development and education, technical education development, entrepreneurship, gender rights, peacebuilding, refugee support, and capacity building for civil society organizations.

The team also possesses high competence in project design, monitoring and evaluation, community mapping, and mobilizing local resources, enabling the association to implement effective, evidence-based interventions that address the real needs of target communities.


Capacity

SHAD strives to provide comprehensive and customized capacity development services that equip NGOs around the country with the strategy, skills, knowledge and capacity to mobilize resources and ensure the availability of educated, skilled, healthy and productive human resources which contribute efficiently to local and regional development.

# Where?

SHAD's staff has experience working in 10 Egyptian governorates as well as international experience implementing trainings in Syria, Turkey and Kurdistan.



Motivated by the need to provide educational alternatives that go beyond the traditional methods available in Egyptian schools and with the drive to stimulate innovation and creativity, in early 2016 SHAD inaugurated Belady Academy for Creativity. In addition to its Cairo-based headquarters, this alternative thinking training center is our main ongoing tool to contribute to stimulating leadership and entrepreneurship

The center provides training in performance arts (dance, music, and theatre), plastic arts (painting and drawing), digital art and software (photography, design and animation) film and book discussion groups as well as formative events. The center serves local children and youth who seek to enrich skills in an enjoyable and fun manner for free or for nominal prices.

### Methodology and Approach

### **Participatory Approach**

We believe it is imperative to fully understand the needs of our beneficiaries before approaching any mission or project. In many cases and when applicable, we work directly with beneficiaries to clearly define scopes of work and solutions. Only then, we are able to design and develop interventions that truly address critical challenges for the groups targeted.



### **Human Rights**

If progress towards equity is made without accompanying progress in other areas funda- mental to human rights, it is likely that the gains will only be short- term and fragile. Therefore, SHAD's endeavors are focused on achieving sustainable progress and results with regard to international human rights standards and operationally directed to promoting and protecting human rights.

### Sustainability

We recognize the importance of mainstreaming clear and visible strategies from the design phase of any developmental intervention. We likewise recognize the need for intervention benefits to be sustainable, where possible, beyond the life of the program. Therefore, we emphasize the importance of clearly defined responsibilities from project inception for all key stakeholders including donors, implementing agency, government and communities. Moreover, our programs contain strong capacity development and system strengthening components to enable communities and/or government to continue interventions once the program has ended.



# European Institute for Cooperation and Development (IECD)

### Support Project for Small, Micro Enterprises and Entrepreneurship in Handicrafts 2024 – Present

For over 30 years, the European Institute for Cooperation and Development (IECD) has been delivering basic management training in nine countries worldwide. The IECD's support for the SME project targets small and micro-business owners who lack the managerial skills necessary to successfully run and grow their projects, by providing them with a tailored training program. The objectives of the Basic Management Training (BMT) program are to support business owners in learning how to achieve greater profitability and sustainability, even under challenging economic conditions, while understanding their responsibilities.

In partnership with the Supportive Homeland Association for Development (SHAD), the IECD has implemented a project to support small and micro-enterprises and empower entrepreneurs to manage their projects effectively from the second half of 2024 until now. SHAD has reached the most vulnerable target groups to economically empower them, enabling girls, women, and youth to adopt their business ideas and sustain them, thereby enhancing their capabilities.

### Objective

The project aims to contribute to addressing the root causes of irregular migration, reducing unemployment rates, and preparing and enhancing the skills of young men and women to join the labor market.

This will be achieved by building the technical and practical capacities of 315 unemployed youth, aged between 18 and 29 enabling them to access decent and rewarding job opportunities.

The project also targets providing employment opportunities for no less than 200 beneficiaries out of the total participants in the various project activities, in decent jobs inside and outside Gharbia Governorate, in sectors including:

- Fast food restaurants
- Refrigeration and air conditioning
- Finishing works
- Packaging
- Telesales and call center services, especially for persons with disabilities.



It also targeted interconnection interdependence between civil society organizations and the beneficiary groups to integrate them into society. This was done by creating job opportunities for Egyptian youth and refugees and building their technical capabilities to set up and manage small projects based on their needs and market's. The project targeted 120 direct beneficiaries and 1,000 indirect beneficiaries from the families of refugees and Egyptians.

# Our Health | Egyptian Jurists Association

Improving health, and safe handling of live poultry for women 2017 - 2018

### Objective

Improving living conditions, and raising awareness, especially for children and women. This goal is achieved through: Improving the services and performance of the nursing and administrative team in the local health unit, family planning clinics, gynecology and dentistry at Boulag El-Dakrour General Hospital. This includes a physical renovation of the center, modernization of information and communication systems, and renewal of the infrastructure related to clinics, in addition to building the capacities of the nursing team and administrators in information management, basic skills and preventive medicine. Enhancing awareness of health issues that are dealt with by the unit and the safe handling of poultry among the residents of the targeted areas to support their livelihoods. Development of the primary health care office in Boulag Al-Dakrour, and the two outpatient clinics buildings in Boulag Al-Dakrour General Hospital.

### Objective

The program aims to protect children at risk of losing parental care and ensure their upbringing in a loving and healthy family environment.

It works directly with families and local communities to empower them to effectively protect and care for their children.

The program's objectives are centered around four main pillars:

- · Providing basic needs.
- Building the capacity of the child and the family to provide care.
- Strengthening support systems for families and children at risk.
- Enhancing the role of the relevant implementing institutions in fulfilling their duties towards children.

A total of 22 families and 61 children were engaged in the Barq Al-Khayam area, and 36 families and 114 children were engaged in the Ard Al-Lewa area
